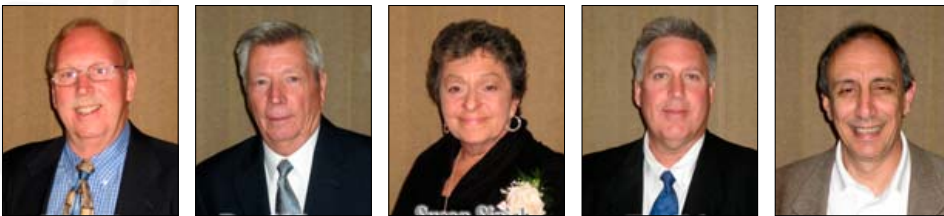

Des Plaines Elks After-School Fishing Program

The Des Plaines Elks After-School Fishing Program runs at three schools for six weeks each, totaling 18 weeks of Elks involvement. The schools currently participating are Cumberland, Immanuel, and Chippewa.



The D.P. Elks provides funding for purchase of the fishing equipment, and this year the Elks National Foundation granted funds. WalMart is also a big supporter of the program donating fishing equipment. Ken Hammond of The Hammond Group in Inverness donated a large assortment of lures and hooks for students' tackle boxes. Tom Symonauis donated a \$50 gift card to

Bass Pro Shops. Shakespeare and Plano give us a student rate on the rods, reels and tackle boxes. Maurice Sporting Goods also gives us a special rate on items.

The class teaches fish identification, choosing the proper size hook, tying knots, casting techniques, conservation, and the anatomy of the fishing rod and pole.

Children's Orthopedic Clinic

The Spring Children's Orthopedic Clinic, sponsored by the Des Plaines Elks, was held on May 7, 2009 at the Northwest Orthopedic Surgery office in Arlington Heights.

Three patients were scheduled for visits. Others did call for appointments, but due to their own health insurance policies, they did not qualify for this program.

A little girl with a toe-walking problem returned from our last clinic. After further evaluation and x-rays, Dr. Marty prescribed daytime leg braces and suggested that she be seen by a Pediatric Neurologist to determine if there could be an additional cause for the toe-walking problem. She needs to return in three months.

A seven-year-old girl was given a prescription for custom bi-lateral arch supports and will need to be seen again in three months. A ten-year-old boy had x-rays taken and was also prescribed custom bi-lateral arch supports. He needs to be seen again in six months.

Des Plaines Elks will pick up the expense of the x-rays and the custom bi-lateral arch supports for these children, as well as the additional leg braces and the Pediatric Neurologist consultation for the child with the toe-walking problem.

Dr. Marty spent a good deal of time with these children, for which we and their families are very grateful. Our Summer Clinic is scheduled for August 6, 2009. ☛

Lodge Picnic Victimized by "Levee 37" Construction

This year's lodge picnic at Lake Avenue Woods has been cancelled.

Flood control project Levee 37 construction began last March. The project runs along the east side of River Road between Palatine Road and Euclid Avenue.

Although the Forest Preserve District (FPDCC) was collaborating on the Levee 37 project with the US Army Corps of Engineers, the Illinois Dept. of Transportation, and Illinois Dept. of Natural Resources, the FPDCC never closed Lake Avenue Woods. Perhaps they missed a meeting or didn't take notes.



Levee 37 flood control expropriated the north side of Lake Avenue Woods, eliminating 30% of the parking and sealing off the exit for our buses.

In any case, Lions Woods, the only other grove in the district with the capacity rating for our picnic remains closed for repairs. The lodge will seek a refund for the grove permit, \$110.00, which was purchased on January 2, 2009 at the Forest Preserve District Headquarters in River Forest, IL.

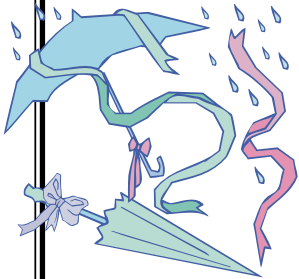

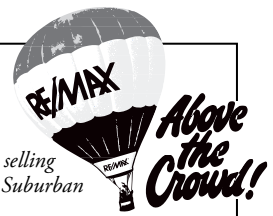
