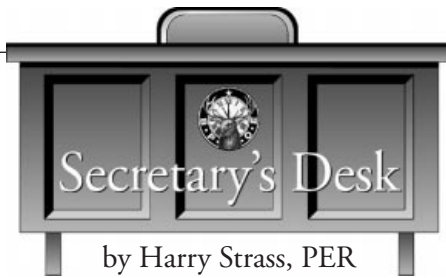

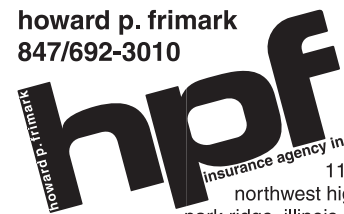

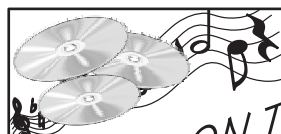

# The Origin of Valentine's Day

Have you ever wondered why we celebrate Valentine's Day?

Did you think it was a covert plot of the major greeting card manufacturers, candy companies and florists to empty our pockets? While some of that may be true, the origins of this day began eons ago, in 269 AD.

Rome was at war. Soldiers were needed, but unwilling to leave their wives and sweet hearts. In an attempt to avoid mass desertion, the Roman emperor, Claudius II, a.k.a. "Claudius, The Cruel," banned marriages and engagements. A priest by the name of Valentine was performing secret marriages, but was eventually caught and jailed. The jailer had a blind, adopted daughter for whom he asked Valentine

to bless. Her eyesight was restored and Valentine fell in love with her. Their love affair was maintained through handwritten love notes and poetry. His last message to her, prior to his execution on February 14, 269 AD, was signed, "From Your Valentine."

Centuries later, the Catholic Church canonized Valentine and February 14 became a holy day celebrated as "The Feast of St. Valentine." During the Victorian Era, when direct expressions of lover were discouraged, sweethearts began the tradition of sending written notes; then the much-cherished paper lace cards (doilies). This custom evolved into the hearts and flowers sentiments and gifts of today.

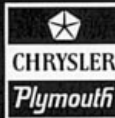
